Working Safely Covid-19 Update

During troubling times, it can be valuable to take stock and look back. So, we would like to explain what Skanska has done to adapt to the challenges of the pandemic, specifically the changes implemented by our team at Mindenhurst, to enable us to work safely during these unprecedented circumstances.

Quite early on during lockdown, the construction industry was identified by the UK Government as being an essential business sector and construction workers were told that they should return to work as soon as possible. While this has given the industry and Skanska a mandate to continue to deliver our projects, it has also presented us with difficult challenges, both practical and moral.

Our core values are at the heart of everything we do, most notably our commitment to 'Care for Life',

which states that we work safely or not at all. Skanska has been committed to that value throughout this pandemic however, we also have a commitment to our customers, and cannot simply put our projects on hold.

Finding ways to work safely has been our priority and we have been closely following the guidance from the government and the Construction Leadership Council. During the eight days in March and April that we paused site activities, we put measures in place to protect our colleagues and the local community, while honoring our commitments to the industry and our customers.

There were substantial changes to our site layouts and working practices which have been adopted well by the workforce and are proving successful in ensuring safety on site, as well as avoiding activities that bring people working on the project into direct, or indirect contact, with the local community. There is a higher focus on hygiene with more cleaners on site and additional facilities for hand washing and sanitising.

It has also been important to continually inform and educate not only ourselves but also the workforce on the most up-to-date guidance and legislation. We will continue to stay adaptable during these changing times but we will not lose focus from our main priority which is to safeguard the wellbeing of our workforce and the community where we work.



orking in an area surrounded by green open space and natural beauty we have a duty to protect the wildlife living here. Monitoring and protecting the ecology across the development is a commitment that Skanska take very seriously. Regardless of the season there is always a lot of activity, whether it is from birds, bats, badgers or reptiles, and our first step is to monitor their activity. To do this we work closely with the Surrey Wildlife Trust who you may well have seen around the area, carrying out wildlife surveys, day and night.

Recently we have been looking at habitat areas across the site that could support a range of reptiles and amphibians. Species recorded include grass snakes, slow worms, common toads, and adders.



Over the last couple of months we have undertaken a reptile translocation programme in an area marked for future works. This began with us situating 50 reptile refugia within this area. The refugia are made from corrugated roofing material which is lightweight and waterproof, providing excellent conditions beneath for reptiles. They were checked daily and within the initial 13-day period, six slow worms and three grass

snakes were found and carefully moved to a safe site within the Central SANGs. After five days clear of reptile sightings each area was carefully checked for reptiles before a vegetation scrape took place. Soil mounds were left to settle allowing any further reptiles to be spotted. Over the two days of vegetation scraping one grass snake, six slow worms, and five common toads were found and carefully moved to a suitable area. This reptile translocation programme means that the future works can be undertaken whilst ensuring that our local reptiles remain safe.

Commited to a **Biodiversity Netgain**

We have adopted a Biodiversity Strategy at Mindenhurst which aims to retain and enhance biodiversity and deliver an overall net gain. We are working closely with Surrey Wildlife Trust's Ecology Services to help us deliver this strategy. This is an approach that increases natural habitat and ecological features over and above that being affected by development. The strategy not only benefits the flora but also safeguards the habitats which allow our wildlife and protected species to thrive.

Carine Guenand, Senior Environmental Advisor explained 'We see this as a long-term strategy, not a short-term enhancement, to protect the environment in the area for future generations.'

We have listened to the local community's feelings about the cutting of wildflowers at the Red Road Roundabout. Unfortunately we were unaware that wildflower seeds had been sown by the community when we carried out this maintenance. pollinators. We have therefore donated wildflower seeds back to the community and Skanska volunteers spent the day sowing additional wildflowers and planting spring bulbs. Sadly this year the British hedgehog became officially classified as vulnerable to extinction. Hedgehogs are thought to be one of the oldest mammals on earth but since the millenium we have lost over a third of the population. As hedgehogs are about to go into hibernation we spent time building and locating hedgehog houses in the SANGs to provide a safe habitat for them to sleep, hibernate, and nest throughout the year.
