Welcome to our monthly construction update newsletter, which we use to keep you up to date with the latest news from Mindenhurst.

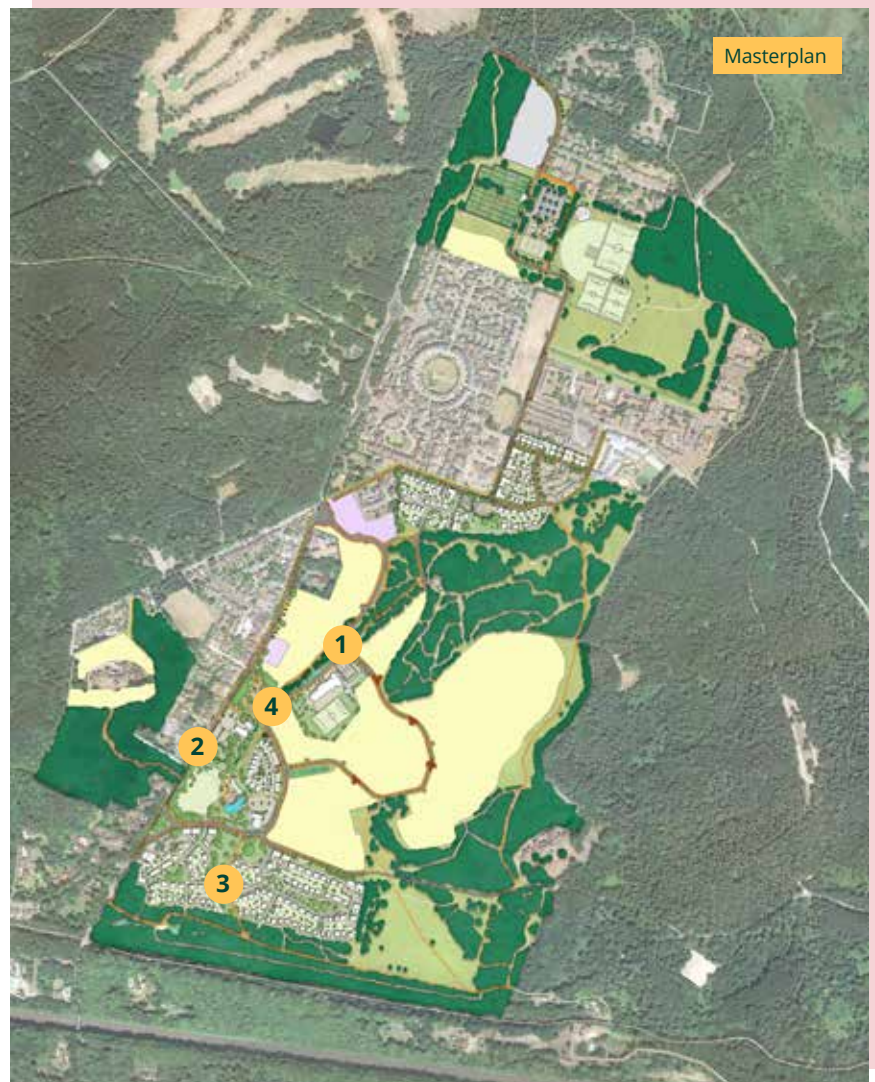

## Construction Update

- 1** Demolition works to the buildings within the Princess Royal Barracks are well underway. This month we will start the mechanical demolition and crushing of the actual buildings. All works will be happening within the secure fence line. There will be additional noise outside of the camp during working hours. The water tower is not currently within the scope for demolition at this time.
- 2** Scaffolding works are progressing on St. Barbara's Church and will progress throughout May. The church will gradually be encased so that external refurbishment works can take place.
- 3** Works are progressing on the Green Swathe and most of the planting will be finished this month. The site will remain closed to allow the vegetation to establish prior to being accessible to residents.
- 4** Repair works and additional works are still ongoing to Mindenhurst Road and will continue through May. This should not cause any issue to the residents, however there will be traffic management measures in place when required.
