Welcome to our monthly construction update newsletter, which will keep you up to date with the latest news and progress from Mindenhurst.



Construction Update

- 1** Demolition will continue within the Princess Royal Barracks to clear the area for new development
 - 2** Demolition of the Officers Mess on Minorca Road will continue to clear the area for new development
 - 3** We expect the works within the trench on Blackdown Road to complete this month, which will allow the trench to be refilled to street level and residential access to be fully opened
 - 4** External works will commence on the church, hoarding will be installed around the church car park to protect the workforce carrying out the refurbishment. The church car park will become busier with deliveries of materials and additional staff vehicles
-  Landscaping maintenance works including watering of plants, trees, and grasses, de-weeding, and mulching will continue across the site.

We started the week with an insightful talk by Surrey Wildlife Trust (SWT) who told us about the different animals living in the area, the best times and locations to spot them, and how we can help species to survive and thrive. SWT also led a bat walk later in the week, where the group got to see and hear Pipistrelle and Soprano bats as they flew overhead catching insects.

We had great fun in our minibeast hunt, discovering all sorts of wonderful bugs and creatures that live in the Central SANG. We enjoyed this so much that we will be holding another session on **24th August at 1pm on the Village Green** for anyone that missed out.

We have also launched our wildlife photography competition and promoted steps you can take to help the hedgehogs.

Planning Update

We are pleased to share that two significant planning applications were unanimously approved by Surrey Heath Borough Council on 4th August.

The planning approvals cover key pieces of site infrastructure, allowing us to embark on the next phase of development. A new Loop Road will be constructed through the heart of the former Princess Royal Barracks to facilitate future phases of new homes. In addition, proposals for the Blackdown Road Alternative Natural Green Space (ANGST) were approved, providing 5.7 hectares of woodland and open space for community use.

These applications were submitted following community consultation in 2021.
