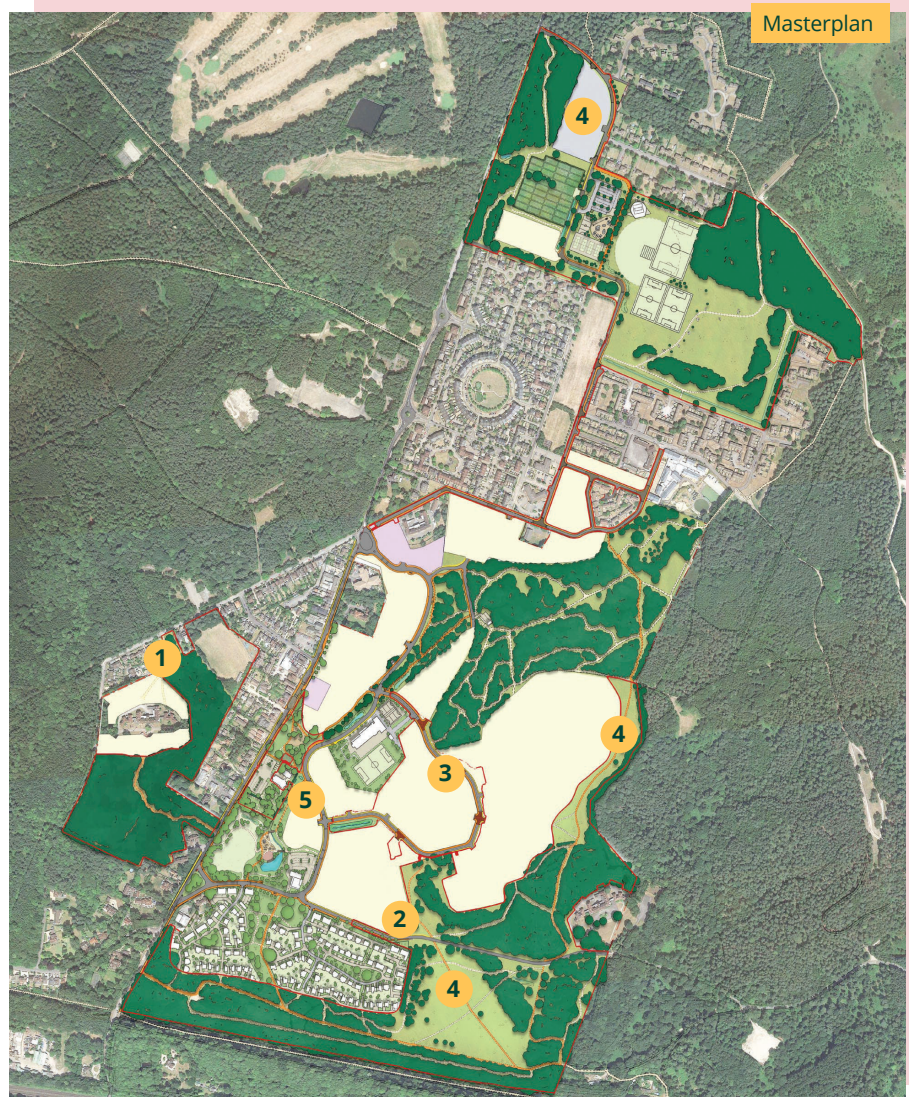

We look forward to sharing with you over the coming months how we have worked alongside the local community to support **'The Queen's Green Canopy'** initiative.

Construction Update

- 1** The trench on Blackdown Road will be refilled following the substation installation. This will return full access along the road.
- 2** Roadworks will commence in front of the Princess Royal Barracks main entrance gate to resurface the road and footpath. Access will be limited during this time to a one-way in/out system and residents will be informed if these works will affect them.
- 3** This month we will finish the demolition of buildings which need to be removed for the construction of the new Loop Road.
- 4** Demolition works will commence inside the camp, including at the assault course and fuel depot, to make way for the Southern SANGs Woodland. Demolition of the Officers Mess on Minorca Road will be completed in October.
- 5** External works on St. Barbara's Church began in September and will continue through October. These will include removing the old painted finish and replacing with a new coating to protect the Church. There will be more vehicles in the church car park for deliveries, but construction vehicles will park within the secure fence line already established in this area.
